Worldwide Foundation for Credit Unions launched its **Ukrainian Credit Union Displacement Fund** as a response to Russia's full-scale war against Ukraine, to mitigate both short and long-term devastating impacts of the war to Ukraine's credit union system and by extension, those that look to it for support, including employees, members and communities.

Scarce supply of diesel fuel critical for credit union member farmers

Financial burden on credit union micro producers caused by inflation

Solution

\$100,000 Fuel Disbursem ent Program

Tetiana Novyk, Small farm owner

"For us, rural people, this is significant support"

Tetiana Novyk, the owner of a small farm with 50 chickens and cows, and a member of Credit Union Koriukivska in Chernihiv Oblast, wanted to contribute to the food security in her community liberated from Russian troops in spring 2022. Using the funds reimbursed under the WFCU program, Tetiana was able to purchase additional fodder for livestock and poultry.
